#### Living in a Dream World by Pastor Phil

I wonder, have you ever been in a situation where you needed to pinch yourself to check that you're not dreaming? I can think of a few such moments in my lifetime. I think we might have missed the fact that we participate in one of these moments as a church family, on a regular basis!

I was reading Exodus 24 this week – it is a fascinating moment. The people of Israel have reached Mount Sinai and God has given Moses the Ten Commandments. The covenant is confirmed, sacrifices are made, blood is shed, God calls Moses and 73 leaders to draw near and they all see God and eat and drink in His presence (vs. 1-11). The parallels with communion in the New Testament are clear. Jesus invites us to eat and drink together, His blood has been shed, the sacrifice is finished and the New Covenant has been established!

Each time we meet around the communion table we are gathering to eat and drink with the living God! This is a level of access that was unimaginable for the Israelites in the Exodus. We have inherited a privileged position in Jesus and we should not take it for granted.

"For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes."
