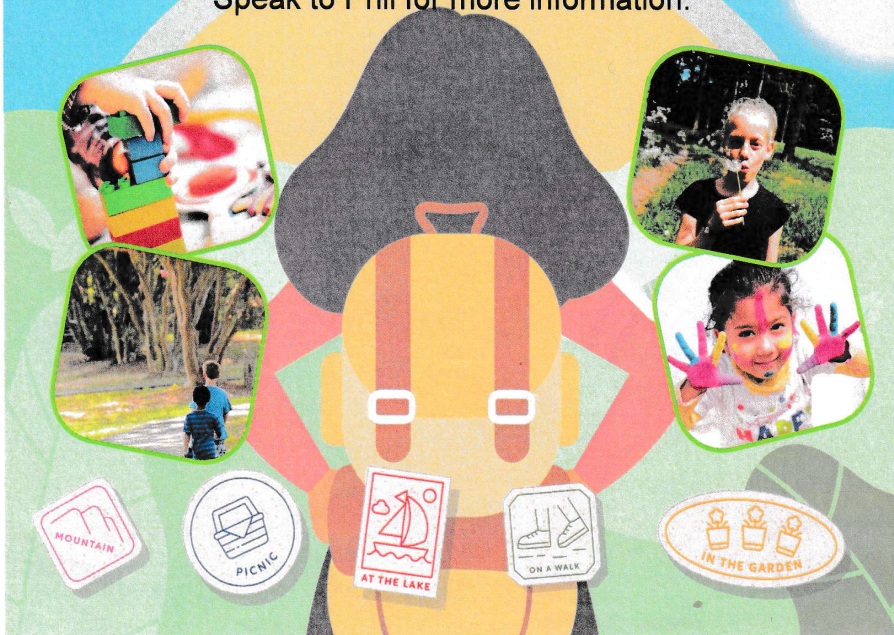

Tyndale 500

2026 is the 500th anniversary of the publication of William Tyndale's English translation of the New Testament. Arguably this is one of the most significant books ever published in the English speaking world as it formed the basis for the King James Version of the Bible, which itself was the most widely read English Bible for the next 400 years.

William Tyndale is a local Hero of the Faith. Records are a little hazy, but William was probably / possibly born at Melksham Court, Stinchcombe around 1494. He may or may not have been educated at Katharine Lady Berkeley's School in Wotton-under-Edge before studying Theology at Magdalen Hall, Oxford University, graduating in 1512. After further study at Cambridge, Tyndale returned to Gloucestershire to become a tutor to the children of Sir John Walsh at Little Sodbury.

Tyndale was fluent in Latin and Greek, as well as several European languages and later taught himself Hebrew in order to translate the Old Testament. Ordained into the priesthood, he was appalled at the level of understanding of the scriptures of his fellow priests and famously declared "if God spares my life, ere many years, I will cause the boy that driveth the plow to know more of the Scriptures than thou dost!"

In 1523 Tyndale left Gloucestershire firstly for London and then Germany, where he began translating the New Testament followed by the Old Testament, completing the Pentateuch in 1530.

Betrayed by a fellow Englishman and condemned as a heretic, Tyndale was martyred in Vilvoorde in 1536, not for his translation work, but rather his Protestant theology.

There are several opportunities to celebrate the memory of William Tyndale over the summer. More details will be available later, but put the dates in your diary:

August 16th Church Picnic at Tyndale's Monument, North Nibley

September 5th Be part of a national 500 mile walk (you only need to do the 5 miles from Wotton) finishing at Tyndale's Monument

September 11th Join other local Christians in a continuous reading of the New Testament. Venue to be decided. October 6th Tyndale evening at church.
